This Addendum forms part of the Contract Documents and modifies the original Bidding Documents issued by Dubois & King, Inc., for the South Main Street Municipal Parking Lot Project & Currier Street Construction Project dated April 2023. Acknowledge receipt of this Addendum in the space provided on Page 1 of the Bid Form. Failure to do so will subject the Bidder to disqualification.

I. Pre-Bid Meeting

A Non-Mandatory Pre-Bid meeting was held at the Project Site on May 3, 2023 at 10:00 a.m. Attendees are listed on the attached Pre-Bid Meeting Attendance Log. Christopher Rivet, of DuBois & King, Inc. described key elements of the project. The following addresses questions received prior to the pre-bid meeting, at the pre-bid meeting, as well as subsequent questions from prospective bidders.

II. Questions & Answers

Question 1. Is there a set start date, or a required completion date for this project? If so, what are the date requirements?

Answer 1. There is no set start date. The Town would like to start with the Currier Street portion as soon as possible after the Notice of Award, dependent on the issuance of the Construction General Permit. The Bid documents indicate a 6-month timeframe to complete construction. However, the Town understands that both Currier Street and the Parking Lot may not be completed in 2023; and therefore the completion requirements will be revised to extend to October 31, 2024.

Question 2. Are both projects being awarded as one contract?

Answer 2. Yes, both projects will be awarded together as one contract. The projects have been separated for bidding and invoicing because they are being financed with funds from separate Town accounts.

Question 3. Will the OHE be removed by others prior to construction?

Answer 3. The OHE will be removed prior to construction. The removal of the OHE will be coordinated with Green Mountain Power by the Contractor, once the proposed underground conduit has been installed.

Question 4. Is there a proposed or approved staging area/laydown yard already in place?

Answer 4. No. A staging/laydown area has not been identified by the Town at this time. The Contractor can propose their own staging/laydown area and/or work with the Town to identify an appropriate area.

Question 5. The detail sheets for both projects call out a 1 1/2" Sch. 80 site lighting conduit, but it doesn't have a bid item. Please clarify how this should be accounted for?

Answer 5. The 1 ½" Schedule 80 Site Lighting Conduit should be wired. It is intended that the Wired Conduit Bid Item be utilized.

Question 6. What size is the wired conduit for S. Main Street, and can you clarify where this is utilized/called out on the plans?

Answer 6. The Wired Conduit Bid Item was utilized for the Site Lighting and EV Charging Station Conduit. This bid item indicates the incorrect conduit size. The conduit size is 1 ½" as noted in the Legend on Sheet E1.

Question 7. Please clarify where the ½" Wired Conduit utilized on Currier Street.

Answer 7. The Wired Conduit on Currier Street is 1 ½" for the Site Lighting on Currier Street as noted in the Legend on Sheet E1.

Question 8. Is the 90 cubic yards of Earth Borrow the correct?

Answer 8. The 90 cubic yards of Earth Borrow is the engineer's estimate from the existing ground surface to the proposed parking lot subgrade in areas of fill. The volume is an estimate for bidding purposes and is subject to adjustment as construction occurs based on actual material used.

Question 9. GMP said a meter is required for the VFW. They can't do it with CT metering.

Answer 9. A meter socket that meets GMP standards will be required. A revised Bid Form is attached to include Bid Item "900.620, Special Provision (Electrical Meter), EA, Quantity 1"

Question 10. Who is responsible for supplying the EV chargers?

Answer 10. The EV Chargers are not included in this Project. The Town anticipates installing them at a later date. Only the charger foundations and wired conduit are included in the Project.

Question 11. Plans say to use a time clock on the parking lot lights, the town standard seems to be photocells. Please confirm.

Answer 11. The intent is to use Photocells and a time clock as noted on Sheet E4 Note 2 of the Parking Plans.

Question 12. Is line item 900.62 work scope to include power pedestal, EV chargers and related work, hand holes, removal of old electrical service to the EV chargers ,etc?

Answer 12. Bid Item 900.620 Bid Item "REMOVE AND RESET EV CHARGING STATION" includes the existing charging stations and related work, removal of the old electrical service wiring, and removing and resetting the existing power pedestal. The charging stations shall be operational upon completion of this work. The proposed hand hole is intended to be covered under Bid Item 678.25.

Question 13. Please provide specs for wood fence.

Answer 13. Wood fence should be 6' high, Northern White Cedar, 4" width stockade style pickets with a smooth finish. Stoackade fence panels to be no longer 10'.

Question 14. Please provide picket size for the ornamental fence.

Answer 14. Ornamental fence to be 4' high three rail with universal top Highland + Steel Commercial Fencing by Master Halco or approved equivalent. Pickets are 3'' square.

Question 14. Is there a Phasing plan for the construction?

Answer 14. The Town has indicated that Currier Street is the priority and needs to be done first. It is anticipated that construction will occur from north to south, starting with Currier, then the northern half of the parking lot, and finishing with the southern half. The Town has indicated that a portion of the parking lot should remain accessible during construction.

III. Miscellaneous Items

1. Bid Item Clarification: Special Provision (EV Charging Station Foundation Base) bid item did not initially include the installation of protective bollards. Through this addendum, the specification for this bid item is amended to include the installation of protective bollards.

ARTICLE 6—BIDDER'S REPRESENTATIONS AND CERTIFICATIONS

6.01 *Bidder's Representations*

- A. In submitting this Bid, Bidder represents the following:
 - 1. Bidder has examined and carefully studied the Bidding Documents, including Addenda.
 - 2. Bidder has visited the Site, conducted a thorough visual examination of the Site and adjacent areas, and become familiar with the general, local, and Site conditions that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
 - 3. Bidder is familiar with all Laws and Regulations that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
 - 4. Bidder has carefully studied the reports of explorations and tests of subsurface conditions at or adjacent to the Site and the drawings of physical conditions relating to existing surface or subsurface structures at the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, with respect to the Technical Data in such reports and drawings.
 - 5. Bidder has carefully studied the reports and drawings relating to Hazardous Environmental Conditions, if any, at or adjacent to the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, with respect to Technical Data in such reports and drawings.

- 6. Bidder has considered the information known to Bidder itself; information commonly known to contractors doing business in the locality of the Site; information and observations obtained from visits to the Site; the Bidding Documents; and the Technical Data identified in the Supplementary Conditions or by definition, with respect to the effect of such information, observations, and Technical Data on (a) the cost, progress, and performance of the Work; (b) the means, methods, techniques, sequences, and procedures of construction to be employed by Bidder, if selected as Contractor; and (c) Bidder's (Contractor's) safety precautions and programs.
- 7. Based on the information and observations referred to in the preceding paragraph, Bidder agrees that no further examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, studies, or data are necessary for the performance of the Work at the Contract Price, within the Contract Times, and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Contract.
- 8. Bidder is aware of the general nature of work to be performed by Owner and others at the Site that relates to the Work as indicated in the Bidding Documents.
- 9. Bidder has given Engineer written notice of all conflicts, errors, ambiguities, or discrepancies that Bidder has discovered in the Bidding Documents, and of discrepancies between Site conditions and the Contract Documents, and the written resolution thereof by Engineer is acceptable to Contractor.
- 10. The Bidding Documents are generally sufficient to indicate and convey understanding of all terms and conditions for performance and furnishing of the Work.
- 11. The submission of this Bid constitutes an incontrovertible representation by Bidder that without exception the Bid and all prices in the Bid are premised upon performing and furnishing the Work required by the Bidding Documents.
