1. Provide deduct alternate pricing to change Panels P-1 and P-EV enclosures to NEMA 3R instead of NEMA 4X. NEMA 4X enclosures shall be priced as the base bid.

<u>Delete</u> Section 410 – Bid Form for Construction Contract in its entirety (8 pages) <u>Replace</u> with revised Bid Form for Construction Contract, Revised 7/11/23 (8 pages), attached.

## **III. QUESTIONS & ANSWERS**

- 1. Will the owner accept a substitution for the box culvert consisting of twin openings with equivalent hydraulic opening area?
  - Yes. Alternatives which provide the necessary cover, meet HS-20 loading, and allow for ADA slopes along the walkway above the proposed box culvert would be acceptable.
- 2. Would rock headwalls be an acceptable substitution for the precast concrete headwalls on each end of the box culvert?

Yes. Boulder headwalls which meet the grading requirements would be acceptable.

- 3. Who is responsible for materials testing and compaction testing? Testing will be completed by the Owner.
- 4. Who is responsible for preparing and monitoring of the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan(SWPPP)?

SWPPP will be prepared by the Owner. Monitoring will be done by the Owner.

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## ARTICLE 6—BIDDER'S REPRESENTATIONS AND CERTIFICATIONS

# 6.01 Bidder's Representations

- A. In submitting this Bid, Bidder represents the following:
  - 1. Bidder has examined and carefully studied the Bidding Documents, including Addenda.
  - 2. Bidder has visited the Site, conducted a thorough visual examination of the Site and adjacent areas, and become familiar with the general, local, and Site conditions that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
  - 3. Bidder is familiar with all Laws and Regulations that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
  - 4. Bidder has carefully studied the reports of explorations and tests of subsurface conditions at or adjacent to the Site and the drawings of physical conditions relating to existing surface or subsurface structures at the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, with respect to the Technical Data in such reports and drawings.
  - Bidder has carefully studied the reports and drawings relating to Hazardous Environmental Conditions, if any, at or adjacent to the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, with respect to Technical Data in such reports and drawings.
  - 6. Bidder has considered the information known to Bidder itself; information commonly known to contractors doing business in the locality of the Site; information and observations obtained from visits to the Site; the Bidding Documents; and the Technical Data identified in the Supplementary Conditions or by definition, with respect to the effect of such information, observations, and Technical Data on (a) the cost, progress, and performance of the Work; (b) the means, methods, techniques, sequences, and procedures of construction to be employed by Bidder, if selected as Contractor; and (c) Bidder's (Contractor's) safety precautions and programs.
  - 7. Based on the information and observations referred to in the preceding paragraph, Bidder agrees that no further examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, studies, or data are necessary for the performance of the Work at the Contract Price, within the Contract Times, and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Contract.
  - 8. Bidder is aware of the general nature of work to be performed by Owner and others at the Site that relates to the Work as indicated in the Bidding Documents.
  - 9. Bidder has given Engineer written notice of all conflicts, errors, ambiguities, or discrepancies that Bidder has discovered in the Bidding Documents, and of discrepancies

- between Site conditions and the Contract Documents, and the written resolution thereof by Engineer is acceptable to Contractor.
- 10. The Bidding Documents are generally sufficient to indicate and convey understanding of all terms and conditions for performance and furnishing of the Work.
- 11. The submission of this Bid constitutes an incontrovertible representation by Bidder that without exception the Bid and all prices in the Bid are premised upon performing and furnishing the Work required by the Bidding Documents.

- 4. Bidder has not engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, or coercive practices in competing for the Contract. For the purposes of this Paragraph 8.02.A:
  - a. Corrupt practice means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of anything of value likely to influence the action of a public official in the bidding process.
  - b. Fraudulent practice means an intentional misrepresentation of facts made (a) to influence the bidding process to the detriment of Owner, (b) to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels, or (c) to deprive Owner of the benefits of free and open competition.
